A Word from Pastor Gehris -

What shall we say and think about Lent? Most people when asked that question will respond by saying, "Lent is the time for giving up something."

There is a subtle temptation here that often leads to self-deception if we are not careful. I remember a middle school student, a member of a youth group, when asked what she was giving up for Lent, responded; "either lipstick or pizza," then she announced her decision . Pizza. Her friend asked her, "Do you like pizza." "heck no," she responded with a smile, "I hate it!"

The business of giving up something for Lent needs careful scrutiny. Frankly, I have never given up anything for Lent. I always felt if there was something I ought to give up during Lent, then I ought to give it up for the rest of the year too. I suspect that many people who give up . coke, beer, or candy during Lent are really more calorie-conscious than Christ-conscious.

I would suggest that Lent is not a season for giving up something but rather a season to place more emphasis on doing something positive. We ought to eliminate the negative in our lives every day. So, let's emphasize the positive aspects of our life, like . worshiping every Sunday, placing a little more in the offering plate, volunteering at church more often or with any other non-profit organization in our area. Let's add something more positive to our lives during Lent.

Worship in March

March 2nd . Transfiguration Sunday - This morning we will pray the Liturgy for The Reign of Christ. The message this morning is entitled "It happened on a Mountain." Read Matthew 17:1-9 before coming to worship today. Today is Food Bank Sunday. Bring a non-perishable item and place it at the door in the North or South Vestibule. All food collected will be delivered to the Nazareth Area Food Bank.

Lent Begins . This year in our Lenten worship experience we will walk the way of Lent and Easter by meditating on the basic teachings of our faith. Each Lenten service will focus on one of the six chief parts of the faith as outlined in the "Small Catechism" of Martin Luther. Lent culminates the mystery of our Lord's death and resurrection, which we celebrate in Holy Week. I pray that this Lent Season will encourage you to make this spiritual journey of repentance and renewal, as we walk the way of Lent and Easter.

March 9th . First Sunday in Lent . Holy Communion This morning we will pray the Liturgy in Lent. The message this morning is entitled "Proclaiming the Word of God as Law and Gospel" Read Matthew 4:1-11 before attending worship today. The Table of Our Lord will be set and we have been invited to share in the elements of Holy Communion, "a Remembrance of Him."

March 16th . Second Sunday in Lent - We will pray the Liturgy of Grace this morning. The message is entitled "Law . The Ten Commandments." Read John 3:1-17 before attending worship this morning.

March 23rd . Third Sunday in Lent - This morning we will pray the General Liturgy. The message is entitled "The Apostles' Creed." Read John 4:5-6 and 31-38 before attending church today.



March 30th . Fourth Sunday in Lent - This morning we will pray the Liturgy in Lent. The message is entitled The New Life . Prayer and The Lord's Prayer.+ Read John 9:35-41 before attending worship today.

The Cemetery Committee reserved the right to remove items from the grave sites after the two week period. Items removed are thrown into the garbage. If you wish to retrieve and save items placed on a grave site, please do that prior to the two week period after any holiday designated in this article.

An up-dated Cemetery Handbook+has been approved by the board and copies of that handbook are available in the Church Office. Anyone who owns a grave site at the Nazareth Moravian Cemetery should have a copy of this up-dated Cemetery Handbook.+


And a friendly reminder -

*The community invited to attend a gala fundraising dinner and auction.***


