From the Pastor's Desk



As I sat thinking about what to write for the November "Chimes" my mind wandered to a story that I had read some months ago.

The story was about how God supplies our needs. I went to one of the bookcases in my office and began to look for the story – wow – the first book I picked off the shelf was the book in which the story appeared. God does move in mysterious ways.

The story is about Brenda who was hurrying through the grocery store one day. She turned down one of the grocery aisles and ran into a display of shoelaces, knocking it over onto the floor. She quickly picked them up and walked away somewhat embarrassed, only to discover she had a pair of brown shoelaces in her hand. She flung it into her cart, paid for it as she checked out and tossed the shoelaces into her purse.

Off she went to the rehab hospital where she had been visiting daily a man named Daniel. Daniel was a member of her church who had fallen off a ladder some weeks ago. Both his legs and arms were paralyzed. She entered Daniel's room and found him unusually despondent. "Brenda," he said to me after some time during our visit, "I feel as though God simply doesn't care anymore about what happens to me." "You know he cares," Brenda began, but had no real answer for him. So they sat for some time in silence.

After some time, Brenda got up and was ready to leave. Donald said, "Oh, by the way, no big deal, but the nurse broke one of my shoelaces this morning. Could you get me a new pair?" Shoelaces! Brenda opened her purse and took out a pair of brown shoelaces. They both stared in amazement. Brenda bent down, took out the old pair of laces and laced in the new ones. Shoelaces! For a pair of shoes on feet that could not move. For a set of hands that couldn't even tie the bow.

"Donald, if God cares enough to supply you with shoelaces before you even ask," Brenda said, "I'm certain He cares enough about you in more important ways." A smile broke out on Donald face, "Yes, you're right," Donald said. "I'm sure too."

Shoelaces – whenever Donald is discouraged, he thinks of his shoelaces. Then he knows that God cares for him, too, meticulously, intimately; right down to the laces in his shoes.

The month of November is Stewardship Month. Please be mindful of how much God cares for you as you consider what your response will be to God and His Church.

and sisters, about the grace of God ... in order that there may be a fair balance." As it is written, "The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little." 2 Corinthians 8:1, 14-15.

Join us in November as we begin this year's "Stewardship" series. The series will culminate on November 30th as we celebrate pledge Sunday.



Worship in November

November 2nd – All Saints Day - The Stewardship message this morning is entitled "Worship." We will meet Sabbatha Steward as she visits with us and shares her story. Read Psalm 66 before attending worship this morning and when you read the Psalm, dwell for a bit on verse 4. We will pray the Liturgy for All Saints this morning and will call to mind those of our membership who have passed on to a greater life since All Saints Day 2013.

November 9th – Holy Communion in Celebration of the Chief Eldership of Jesus Christ. - The Stewardship message this morning is entitled "Learn." We will meet Chris Steward as he visits with us and shares his story. Read Psalm 143 before attending worship today and when you read the Psalm, dwell for a bit on verse 8. We will pray the Liturgy for Education this morning.

November 16th – Pastor Jeff will be leading the Youth Retreat at Camp Hope this weekend. - The Stewardship message this morning is entitled "Serve" and will be presented by our guest speaker, the Rev. Rhonda Robinson, Esperanza for Bethlehem. One of our Elders will be in charge of the service this morning. We will meet Holly Steward as she visits with us and shares her story.

November 23rd – Reign of Christ – Christ the King Sunday - The Stewardship message this morning is entitled "Give." We will meet Buck Steward as he visits with us and shares his story. Read Malachi 3 before attending worship this morning and when you read chapter 3 of Malachi, dwell for a bit on verse 10. We will pray the Liturgy for the Reign of Christ.

November 30th – First Sunday in Advent – Pledge Sunday – Holy Communion - We will begin the Season of Advent by lighting the first candle on the Advent Wreath. We will pray the Liturgy in Advent and sing "The Hosanna" during the praying of the Liturgy. The message this morning is entitled "Keep Alert." Read Mark 13:24-37 before attending worship this morning. We are invited to the "Table of Our Lord" as we prepare our hearts and lives for the coming of the Christ Child and as we received His Body and Blood of the New Covenant. Join us for this joyous day as we celebrate together.



Community Thanksgiving Lovefeast Concert

Join us on Sunday afternoon, November 23rd at 3:00 pm in the Sanctuary for a community celebration thanking God for all he has given to us. We will welcome the community once again to this annual lovefeast concert. This year, by popular demand and at the request of

many people, we will once again feature “The Federal City Brass Band/26th North Carolina Regimental Band” that was organized by the Moravians at Winston-Salem, North Carolina during the Civil War. This Army Regimental Brass Band, with the exception of some reproduction rope-tension drums, will play many of the original instruments dating back to the mid-19th century. Today, the band is based in Baltimore, MD, but some of its members travel as far away as parts of New York State, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

The concert is underwritten through the generous support of The Wilson T. and Mildred A. Boerstler Music Fund. Wilson and Mildred Boerstler were long-time, active members of the Nazareth Moravian Church. The Music Fund was established by the Boerstler children, Glenn and Nancy Ann, following Wilson’s death in 1995 to recognize Wilson’s 72 years of playing instrumental music for the church and for both Wilson’s and Mildred’s dedication to music as part of the ministry of God.

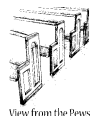

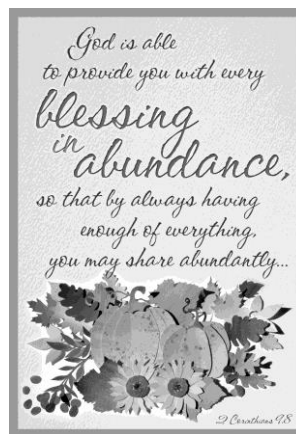
MORAVIAN YOUNG ADULT CONVO 2015 THIS SUMMER! JULY 5 – 13, 2015! CZECH REPUBLIC AND GERMANY!

Every four years Moravian young adults in North America have the opportunity to come together for a Moravian Young Adult Convocation. The next Young Adult Convo is this summer as participants will travel to the Czech Republic and Germany to see many of the historic Moravian sites and to find inspiration and vision for current ministry. In the Czech Republic the trip includes visiting Prague (where John Hus preached), Kunwald (where the Unitas Fratrum, the early Moravian Church, first settled), and the Chalice Rocks (where members of the Unitas Fratrum met during their time of persecution). In Germany the trip includes visiting Herrnhut (where the Unitas Fratrum experienced a great spiritual renewal).

All Moravian young adults ages 18 through 26 are invited to attend this summer's Moravian Youth Adult Convo 2015. The dates for the trip are July 5–13, 2015. The theme for the trip is "Make the Moravian Journey Home and Catch a Vision for Our Future!"

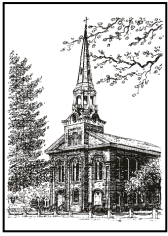
