September 21 – Joyful Noise Offering - Fellowship After Worship - Our call to worship this morning is Psalm 145:1-8 and we will pray the Liturgy for Grace during the 8:15 AM Service. We will welcome into communicant membership a number of people as well as baptize one adult and one infant during our 10:45 AM service. During 10:45 worship we will also dedicate and install our Sunday School workers and will present our 3rd graders with Bibles.

The message this morning is entitled "Giving as God Gives." Read Matthew 20:1-16 before worshipping this morning.

September 28 – All Choirs Lovefeast – 8:15 AM and 10:45 AM - Our call to worship this morning is Psalm 25:1-9 and we will pray the Liturgy for Christian Homes together. The message title is "These Things." Read Matthew 21:23-32 before attending worship this morning.

Fall Bible Study

The Fall Bible Study will begin on Wednesday September 10th at 7 PM. There will be a sign-up sheet on the table in the rear of the Chapel. We will be studying the book of Daniel. This ten week study will guide us chapter by chapter through the Old



Testament book of Daniel.

“What Jesus said about the prophet John the Baptist we could say about the prophet Daniel. What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? ... But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I say to you, and more than a prophet.” Matthew 11:7 & 9.

“Daniel dared to be different. Instead of bending and blending like a reed, he stood like a mighty oak, rooted in the Lord and defying the storms of change that raged about him.”

Society today is a good deal like the one Daniel lived in centuries ago. The world still wants God’s people to conform to its standards and follow its practices. “Don’t let the world around you squeeze you into its own mold” is the way J.B. Philips translates Romans 12:2, and Daniel and his friends obeyed that admonition. As we study the book of Daniel, we will meet Daniel’s God, the Sovereign Lord who rules in the kingdom of men and who confidently announces things to come. In Daniel’s life and ministry we see how true believers live in the light of biblical prophecy – how they relate to the Sovereign Lord and accomplish His good, acceptable, and perfect will.

Summer Lunch Program – This ten week program which began in June and ended in August was very successful. There were 375 volunteers who served over the ten week period, some serving once others serving five, six or more days. The volunteers prepared and served 4,095 bagged lunches over the ten week period. The cost for the ten week period was \$4,723.44 which breaks down to \$1.15 per bagged lunch.


Costs were kept down because of all the items we had donated this year towards the Summer Lunch Program; from Stroehmann’s Bread Outlet, Nazareth Area Food Bank, Bath Area Food Bank, Loaves-N-Fishes Pantry, and many churches and individuals who donated food and paper items. We were also blessed with funds from grants, businesses in our area, churches as well as individuals. What a wonderful blessing we have received while we minister to and with those who may be hungry. “Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? ... The Rules and Regulations of Nazareth Moravian Cemetery state that all items placed on a grave site, i.e. flowers, arrangements, etc., must be removed two weeks after a holiday. Holidays are designated as Easter, Mother’s Day, Memorial Day, Father’s Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. The Cemetery Committee reserves the right to remove items from the gravesites on the cemetery after the two week period. Items removed are thrown into the garbage. If you wish to retrieve and save items placed on a gravesite, please do that prior to the two week period after any holiday designated in this article.

Reports from Nazareth Moravian Delegates to the June 2014 Provincial Synod -

Moravian Church Northern Province Synod of 2014 was held at Moravian College from June 19th to June 23rd. Pastor Jeff, Rodney Ward and I, Dana Price, were the delegates for Nazareth Moravian Church. After 5 long days of whole group and Committee meetings, 8:00am to 9:00pm daily, I came away tired of sitting but never prouder of being a Moravian.

Did you know that Lancaster Moravian Church was so convinced that their church and community needed a Geriatric Daycare center that they sold their small church building and moved into the second floor of the new downtown bus depot? They use the building for their Geriatric Daycare Mon. through Fridays. On the weekends, they use that space for their church services and other activities.

Did you know that in Canada, they have a coffee house ministry where they are reaching people who probably would not set foot in a traditional church building. They go there for some coffee and a little religion on the side.

Did you know that one of our churches in Delaware is sharing their building with a Baptist church because they had lost their church?

We have a number of congregations who can't afford a full time pastor? They are staying together and hoping to come to a point where they will be able to get someone full time.

The next Youth Convo is for 18 – 25ish young adults and will be held in Prague. It is July 5 – 13, 2015 and should cost about \$2,400 each. Check the Moravian website for more details.

We voted on many issues, passed some, rejected some and sent others back to committee for additional study. The whole time, it was like there was an "elephant" in the room. We all knew that we would be voting on a motion to allow the ordination of gay and lesbian ministers.

There were many people who felt strongly on this issue, both for and against it. I had been at two other Synods where it was discussed but sent back to committee for further study. This time, it was going to come to a vote. On Sunday, morning, the report was read and Sunday afternoon, it came up for discussion. It was discussed from 1:30 pm to about 4:30 pm. One person would stand up and speak for it and then one person would speak against it. Some people would talk about 3 or 4 min. and some would talk 10 min. (The room was full of pastors and you know how they can go on...sorry, Pastor Jeff.) It finally got to be that no one else wanted to speak against it and people spoke for it for another 20 min. or so.

It was time for the vote. The room was tense. It was a paper ballot. We all wrote yes or no and passed in our vote. The ballots were collected. Mr. Santee suggested that we sing while they were being counted. We all thankfully stood and started singing. Our row began holding hands but found it wasn't enough. Soon, the

whole room moved to the outskirts and circled the room holding hands and singing. We sang and sang and sang some more.

One song that keeps coming back to my head, Join We All with One Accord....All have made His will our choice....One in spirit, one in life....so, in Christ, we all are one. By the time Mr. Santee came back in the room, there was a strange calming effect over the whole room. Mr. Santee stood up to the mic and said that the motion had passed. There were no shouts of joy or outcry of discord. I think other people like me felt that the will of the Lord had been done. It was an amazing experience.

The day after, I tried to talk to people about it but I believe we were all too emotional to speak about it. It still brings tears to my eyes. The common consensus was that by the time the result was read, it didn't matter which way the vote went. Whatever the results, that is what it should be. (The results were 188 to 66) I would be remiss if I didn't mention singing for 5 days in a room full of 250+ Moravians. There is nothing like it. We sang sometimes with guitar and bongo, sometimes with keyboard, but always with heart.

I was one of the 267 delegates attending the 2014 Synod of the Moravian Church's Northern Province which convened at the Moravian College from June 19th through June 23, 2014.

We as delegates were charged as the legislative authority to elect our leaders, and to direct them to carry out our resolutions.

We reviewed many proposals which were previously submitted from the 2010 Synod in addition to a myriad of proposals submitted by the current 2014 Synod committees.

I discussed each proposal individually, in committees, and in an open forum where each delegate voted to approve or reject the resolution.

Myself and all my brothers and sisters felt and understood the importance and ramification of our decisions. We all sought God's guidance through daily congregational worship and daily devotion and individual prayers.

I met Moravians of all ages and from all walks of life. We spoke out in open forums and with each other the merits of each issue for which the delegates possessed some very strong opinions and feelings.

I observed tears in the eyes of many who were happy or disappointed in the final tally of votes either accepting or rejecting the proposals. However, there was not one outburst of cheering or display of anger heard. Instead throughout the entire delegation each of us held his brother's or sister's hands, stood in a circle around the hall in prayer and singing.

I sincerely considered myself privileged to have served the Lord in this truly democratic process.


